


It's great to know your strengths and decide on life goals, but how do you actually reach those goals? You need an action plan.



STEP 1. WHERE TO LOOK FOR A JOB

Face-to-face

Basically, this means approaching an employer at their workplace to ask about the possibility of working for them. Seems scary, we know... But on the plus side, it means you can target the specific business you want to work for!

Be sure to take a resumé and cover letter with you, since an employer may follow up at a later date if they don't have an immediate vacancy.





Online job platforms

Online job platforms give you a chance to search for a range of roles that suit your interests. There are many job boards, but we suggest checking out the Skillsroad Jobs Board for a range of casual, part-time and full-time roles, apprenticeships and traineeships. Making a call

Trust us, it's as simple as it sounds! Calling a business that hasn't advertised any vacant roles just to check if there are any jobs available can be very useful.

How to make a successful call:

- Be clear in your mind about the purpose of your call
- Find out as much as you can about the business before making the call
- Make notes about the questions you want to ask and the information you'll need to give
- Clearly state your name and who you want to talk to at the start of the call
- Have an answer prepared if you go to voicemail!



APPLYING FOR A JOB

A cover letter

A cover letter is a short (one page), tailored letter that should always accompany any resumé that you send to a prospective employer. Your cover letter creates the all-important first impression.

Your resumé

Your resumé is a valuable marketing tool – a way to sell yourself. It has one main purpose: to win you a job interview by highlighting your experience and skills. Make sure you stand out!
